

Learn where candidates stand on issues that concern voters



### STEP 1

Enter your address to find your races

Mark your informed choices

Print your list of choices to use as a reference when you vote

- Information customized to a user's address so you see only the candidates and ballot issues that will be on your ballot
- Detailed information on the candidates and their responses in their own words to questions provided by the League
- Explanations of all ballot propositions in clear language and nonpartisan arguments for and against each

- Learn about eligibility requirements
